<p>So far SQ Committee has....</p>	<p>We have perused and sought legal advice on the Draft Licence Agreement between SQ and Northshore. Modifications are now being made and sign off expected next week.</p> <p>As the Outdoor Exhibition will be held on Government owned public land, we will need to satisfy certain Workplace Health &amp; Safety and Site Rules. These are not onerous but a necessary part of this agreement and relevant mostly to installation and dismantling days. Details that are specific to sculptors, will be provided once we have them approved.</p> <p>On behalf of our members, we are ensuring the appropriate Risk Assessment issues are addressed and Installation Management plan is being developed.</p> <p>We have developed a good working relationship with the Northshore staff managing the project and are happy with our progress, despite delays in the Contract.</p> <p>We have renewed the Entry Form for this Exhibition and it will be sent in the near future.</p> <p>We have proposed 2 days in October, for artists to choose one, where they can come and collect or choose wharf timbers from the site. We await Northshore letting us know their dates of choice to assist us. This information will be emailed.</p>
<p>Members to do ...</p>	<p>Start planning sculptures that reflect the history of the river as per the short version attached of the History document. There is much flexibility around interpreting this space through sculptures as the the site has had many purposes over time.</p> <p>By date 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2020, <u>All sculptures</u> that are being submitted need to have a photo or drawing sent to Exhibition Coordinator, so we can select those pieces for the Exhibition. We do not want to have members paying for say 3 pieces and then</p>

	<p>we having to reimburse payment if we can only take 2 on installation day. We did this for outdoor sculptures at Mt Coot-tha but for this Exhibition only, we need indoor works sent as well.</p> <p>Read Entry Form in detail, especially Important Dates &amp; Conditions of Entry, use of Wharf timbers</p> <p>Enquire about insurance in case your sculpture causes damage to others</p>
