### Sculptures at Northshore Hamilton - March 2020

Date	<p>29<sup>th</sup> March 2020. Opening night still to be decided.</p> <p>Outdoor sculptures will be installed during the week prior.</p> <p>We have approval for the Indoor Exhibition to include 2 weekends – 11 days in duration (at no cost to Sculptors Queensland)</p>
Philosophy	<p>EDQ's development along the riverfront aims to amplify the cultural heritage of the area. Staff at EDQ have recently completed a document that outlines the history of the region and have requested that the Outdoor sculptures reflect in some way a portion of this heritage.</p> <p>They have provided us with a copy (which is attached). Please read and develop your creative ideas that are sympathetic to the site.</p> <p>Most of the old wharf timbers have been retained for reuse in the landscaping as the site develops over the next 5 – 10 yrs. Some of these are the ones that are being offered to us for use with our riverfront sculptures.</p>
	<p>As mentioned in the prior information, the event will commence with an indoor exhibition held in The Shed, adjacent to Eat Street, followed by an outdoor exhibition curated by Sculptors Qld for a <u>period of three months</u>. The outdoor exhibition will be along the riverfront (sculpture locations to be determined) illustrated in orange on the map attached. We estimate that the space will be able to support at least 30 quality sculptures.</p>
We Aim to Provide	<p>Space for approximately 50 smaller indoor works. A selection process may need be introduced given the reduced space.</p> <p>There will be a different Entry Form for this Special Exhibition, with relaxed entry criteria, please watch out for this future email. We will inform all members.</p> <p>There will be no judging, but all works will be available for sale.</p> <p>Prior sculptures which are older than 2 yrs, can be submitted for selection.</p> <p>SQ members will assist in the running of the indoor exhibition.</p>
	<p>As mentioned previously, this exhibition is offered to all members but is not meant to replace our Mt Coot-tha Annual Exhibition which will be held in the first week of June 2020. We still encourage vigorous support for our important Brisbane Sculpture Festival. The available date for 2020 is in the first week of June.</p>
